San Ysidro, NM

April 5, 2009

It is difficult to fathom—the New Mexico Trials Association has ridden it's penultimate event at San Ysidro for the year, not to return until December. In years past, the club has ridden San Ysidro in May, then taken a break till fall. This year, we head to Las Vegas in May, and the trek back in the fall has turned into a return in winter, as Lake Fork and Roswell were shuffled in the last couple of years.

Be sure to thank Rob O'Niell, Roxana Meline, and Randal Cannady for their Trialsmaster efforts with the April 5th NMTA Round 3. The weekend had a large turnout of families camping, with many arriving Friday. The weather fluctuated all weekend, slightly overcast and calm Friday, chilly and breezy Saturday, and warming throughout the day Sunday, with the afternoon being very pleasant.

Chuck Sutton held a trials school Saturday, with about 16 riders partaking. Riders learned about bike set up, proper stance, turns, wheelies, and ledges. Chuck is an excellent instructor. If you have never been through one of his classes, consider signing up next time he has a class.

Sunday morning had a long sign-up again, as 84 riders turned out for the event. New riders continue to show up, eagerly wanting to try our sport. Numerous club regulars failed to make it, either because of injury recovery, or unknown other obligations. Speculation, however, indicates we could hit 100 riders at a future event. New membership is healthy for our club and our sport. For you club regulars, please spend some time with new members; we need to ensure they understand the importance of staying on the trails at Say Ysidro, keeping the combination for club members only, and preserving our positive club image with the BLM.

On to the trial.... The crispy morning welcomed the Lower Classes on the loop heading toward the top of Upper Pool. The eight-section loop began with Section One lying just outside of the pit area, offering multiple turns and a mixture of rock and sand. The first section seemed to collect points from riders' feet more than most other sections, with Section Three behaving similarly.

Riders appeared to handle the loop and sections well, and spectators enjoyed the easy-walking loop.

Spectators had a little more exercise with the afternoon loop. The Upper Class loop began in Lower Pool with the first four sections in easy walking distance. It is nice to see the new riders in the club, but spectators seem to be increasing as well, especially in the afternoon. Numerous people lined the ridge of Lower Pool watching from a good vantage point as the afternoon riders handled the rocky sections near camp. Champs had some spectacular climbs and jumps along this part of the loop.

Poor Bob Rowland picked up five of his nine points for the entire day in Section One when I told him he couldn't go

through a certain gate. Of course I think of esteemed Bob as an Expert, and saw him walking the Semi-Expert line. Bob, an experienced, thoughtful rider, agreed with me, and rode the section cleanly. The scorers quickly pointed out that he missed a gate. Sorry, Bob—my fault. I was not trying to misguide you.

Bob was riding Semi-Expert and doing some lobbying for a new class. You may have seen that Lance opened a dialogue on the discussion group about this subject. No new classes yet, but who knows, we could have Senior-Junior, Intermediate-OuttaShape, or Expert-NeverPractices.

Back to the loop ... riders went far down Lower Pool and picked up a trail to an area seldom ridden. Sections Five, Six, and Seven had few people other than the riders, and challenged riders with loose, reddish dirt and rubble, and involved a couple of small ravines. I cannot recall ever riding this area. These three sections had were along an established trail, but were definitely not the typical San Ysidro fare.

Section Eight was near the dirt road feeding into the pit area, and used the road as part of the loop. A few spectators went to see Eight by using the road to get to the section. It was an easy end for the loop, and the ride along the road back to camp was a welcomed relaxing stretch, especially after the pounding heading toward Section Five.

Again, great job Trialsmasters. The next event is May 2nd and 3rd in Las Vegas. Thank you Allen Witters for having us—not once, but three times this year. New Mexico is host to the Youth Nationals West on August 8, 9, and 10 at Allen's ranch. We should have a large turnout from our club, and we hope from neighboring states as well. The NMTA returns again September 5th and 6th for the second club event at Allen's. Thank you, Allen, for being so generous to our club. And thank you David Old for getting Allen involved with the NMTA and motorcycle trials.

Maintenance Shack

This month's Shack will be short and sweet, due to the fact that I am preparing to go to Texas for a TOTTA event on the 18th and 19th this month. Let's get busy.

Dale Higgenbotham and I were talking recently about pesky oil leaks that sometimes occur even with new gaskets. He was wondering what kind of gasket sealer can (or should) be used when replacing engine gaskets.

Since I worked in Honda dealerships for years, I naturally revert to using Hondabond HT (high temperature) for sealing duties. Thicker than "regular" Hondabond, it can be applied to gaskets or gasket surfaces in a nice, thin film without the dreaded "goop ooze" dripping out of assembled components. Yamaha also markets the exact same sealant under their house brand "Yamabond". Both of these sealers are based off of the original "Durabond" brand of silicone-based gasket sealers.

When I don't have access to either Hondabond or Yamabond, I revert back to the old tried-and-true Permatex high-temp black RTV gasket maker. Why the black? Simple. One, it works everywhere from clutch covers to exhaust pipes, and two, in my humble opinion black simply looks better than blue or orange goop peeking out of an assembled component.

Notice the key word in this article is "thinly". Great amounts of goop is not necessary to seal up gasketed or even gasketless surfaces. As a side benefit, gaskets are much easier to remove when treated to a thin veneer of sealer, as opposed to being installed "dry". This is particularly beneficial to be used with the OE Honda/Montesa gaskets, which have a ridiculously strong bonding agent applied to the paper surface to aid sealing. It works, alright. The green Honda/Montesa gaskets are almost impossible to scrape off without destroying the sealing surface. A thin

layer of sealer prevents this, making old gasket removal a breeze.

Thanks to Dale for the article suggestion! If anyone else has a suggestion for the Shack, please let me know!

Stay on 83 approx. **8.6 miles**. Where paved hwy turns sharp right, go straight onto the **Dirt Road** (look for sign, watch for traffic from north). Go approx **2.5 miles** on dirt road Cross a small bridge, take **1st left after the bridge**, go thru San Geronimo then take **Left at the "T"** at the top of the small hill, go approx. **2.9 miles**, go **Left at the new gate** marked with ribbon
