A long chat from Da Prez

Summer's here, and it's time to head for the hills before it gets too hot. Many thanks to Curtis Kohl, Al Terreault, and Greg and Kyle Goon for setting the last San Ysidro trial until winter. All their hard work in trying circumstances produced two challenging days of riding. Though we are done for now at San Ysidro, keep your ears open for a call to service. BLM will probably have some materials for a new kiosk, and we'll try and do some other maintenance projects at the same time.

I want to give a special thank-you to Konrad Clark for his extra effort protecting the local SY wildlife and our club members at the same time. His care in protecting the snake from us and vice versa embodies the ideal of stewardship that is essential to keeping access for our club.

Chris Porter did spot-checks for spark arrestors at San Ysidro and found most everybody compliant or ready to take corrective action. Expect more of the same at Sipapu and at our other forest events this year. If you are like me and are still struggling to get your machines registered, try that line again before Sipapu. According to the state's OHV law, the NM Game and Fish Department can conduct "DUI-type

enforcement blitzes" (roadblocks) to look for spark arrestors and proof of registration and youth safety training. I don't know if our club can expect a

visit, but we need to be prepared. For more info about the state OHV law's requirements, see the Game and Fish website at www.b4uride.com.

After the Sipapu event, we are scheduled to make several trips to Alan Witters' Jagged Ridge Ranch near Las Vegas. Alan's place has some of the most spectacular riding in the state. Unfortunately, this may be the last year we get to ride there, because Alan informs us that the ranch is on the market. While the club has been saving to buy some land, and actively investigating leads as they present themselves, Alan's place is priced beyond our means. If you or someone you know is sitting on a nest egg that has weathered the recent economic turmoil, and the idea of owning some of the finest riding property in the nation sounds like a good investment, please let your Board members know. Both Alan and the board are eager to discuss possible deals to secure this trials paradise for the future.

As you can imagine, the market for big beautiful New Mexico ranches is somewhat more limited than your average city house market (although my house isn't moving very fast :-). Our access for the rest of the year does not appear to be in jeopardy by any impending sale. However, we still need Trialsmasters to do the work. The Aug. 8 Las Vegas date has openings for a Lower TM and Floater, and the Sep. 4 LV Floater spot is still open. Many thanks to the most recent TM volunteers: Tim Elsen for Lake Fork, and Kristi Hopper and James Huggins for Roswell. Tim has already set an event at San Ysidro this year for TM points--the next one he's doing just

for fun (and because he's a heck of a guy who wants to see the club succeed). Show Tim your appreciation and volunteer to be his Floater at Lake Fork on Oct. 3rd. The Board is discussing the idea of promoting a National event in 2011, as tentatively expressed to the NATC last fall. Where and when we should hold the event is still up in the air, as well as who will organize it. In other words, we have an idea and not much more. If you have a burning desire to make a New Mexico National happen in 2011, please let me know.

This month the President's Note is really hard to write. As most of you have probably heard by now, NMTA lost one of its members recently--David Luck died in a rafting accident in Colorado. I'm sure I speak for the whole club in expressing our sympathy to David's family and friends. I'm asking the club membership for appropriate ideas to memorialize David. Please pass your suggestions on to a Board member so that we may take action.

The club still needs someone to step up and volunteer to set the Upper class sections for our upcoming event at Jagged Ridge Ranch near Las Vegas. The August 7 slot has come vacant, as well as the August 8 floater position. If you are riding in our series, you need to be contributing to making the series happen. Please step up so I don't have to start calling people. I have many things to do -- begging for trialsmasters should never have to be on any club president's honey-do list. At Sipapu and at the latest Board meeting, the Board discussed the prospect of NMTA hosting another round of the AMA/NATC National Observed Trials Championship at Sipapu Resort. Bruce has agreed to work with the Resort management and



the Forest Service, Brian says we can get a round later in the year so we can have a club trial early and the National in the fall, and Lance has said he agrees to lead the organization and staffing of the event. Now it is up to you, the members of NMTA.

While many of our members ride in the Nationals, and look forward to having an event close to home, the reality is that we need volunteers for scorers and all the other tasks running a National entails. So look at the insert accompanying this newsletter: it asks you to COMMIT to making a successful National round happen, by committing to fulfill one or more volunteer roles. If you really can't commit to helping, please respond on the insert anyway. We need to know if we lack the backing of the club, so we can tell Brian that NMTA can't be counted on. Return your completed insert form to any Board member or at the sign-up table for the next event.

Several club members have noted to me that NMTA's events have become huge campouts, with dozens of people living in close quarters for a weekend. Unfortunately, the close quarters can present opportunity for conflict if we forget to consider the safety and comfort of others. Of particular concern are the children and animals we bring with us. Please remind your kids to respect the belongings and privacy of others, and please keep your animals under control. Nobody enjoys stepping in dog crap, especially in his or her own campsite. You should know if your dog can be trusted among other animals, and especially among people riding motorcycles. We are, after all, a motorcycle club. I saw several loose dogs in the Junior sections at Sipapu--fortunately none caused any accidents, but it could happen. I consider it fortunate in that we have avoided the irresponsible behavior that is giving OHV recreation a bad name in the southern California dunes areas. Loud and reckless camping will get us kicked out of public lands as fast as any endangered salamander. Finally, several of our riding areas are coming up for planning decisions by the BLM and Forest Service. The

National Environmental Protection Act (NEPA) governs how planning is to be done, and provides a role for citizens to comment on the plans that affect them. I will be asking you to participate in the comment periods for the San Ysidro, Carson NF/Camino Real district, and Santa Fe NF/Jemez district planning documents as soon as they hit the streets. We have only a limited amount of time to comment under the law --30 or 45 days is typical--and if you don't comment in that period, you don't have standing to appeal any bad decision. Be ready when I call for comment volunteers. If we lose our riding areas because we didn't participate in the NEPA process, we have no one but ourselves to blame.

Tim was right, and David became a force to be reckoned with in Intermediate almost immediately after joining. With his great competitive spirit and crazy sense of humor, David was a wonderful fit with NMTA. It's no surprise that his memorial was Standing Room Only, with family and many, many friends sharing "D-Luck" stories, including (but not limited to) David's creative interpretations for road construction orange cone usage, apparent disdain for (and consequent abuse of) golf courses and rental cars, and an uncanny knack for "borrowing" airport security golf carts (and therefore discovering that airports have jails). David had a true zest for life and lived it fully, enjoying activities such as Heli-skiing, Skydiving, Skindiving, Whitewater Rafting, Off-Road riding, Roadracing, Desert Racing, Trials, and much more. David was a

great competitor, a true friend to many, and he will be missed.

Kyle's lowers for Sunday started in the practice area in the mouth of Upper Pool, and ran right up the heart of the canyon. "Make you think, and walk it again" should have been the theme of Sunday's lower event. Savvy riders who studied the sections (not just "looked" at them) were rewarded with low scores and bragging rights for a trial that at a quick glance looked pretty challenging. I'm not saying.....

Kyle-and-crew's upper's started in Upper Pool, and flowed all the way down to Lower Pool. They had some real challenge to them. Big obstacles, little run, and silly-tight turns (with some long climbs thrown in for fun) had some riders scrambling to change classes before or right after the competition started. A tough weekend for sure, but sure a lot of fun! Kudos again to the Trialsmasters for making the WHOLE event happen!

On another note, some of you might have noticed me inspecting the tailpipe of your trialer on competition weekends. Yes, I am looking for spark arrestors. Some have gotten a bit lax about having one installed anytime we ride on Government land (yes, ALL Government land!), and I'm merely trying to ensure that we are in compliance with the Special Use Permits that allow us to ride these places. If you discover that your bike (or the bikes you are responsible for!) are not equipped with one, please see Trevor at the Trialdog Motorsports rig to get the latest cool arrestors available. I will be inspecting bikes at each event that require one. I REALLY hate and don't want to be a "cop" about this. Please don't make me.

Again, a HUGE thanks goes out to the Trialsmasters for going well above and beyond the call of duty. Thanks, fellas, well done. Also, have you all remembered to thank your scorers? They volunteer their time and efforts also to make sure that our NMTA events come off safe, fair, and smooth. I am keeping track of scoring volunteers throughout the year. There MAY be cool awards at the banquet for those folks who step up often.....

And off to the mountains we went! Rounds 6 & 7 were held at our beloved Sipapu Ski Resort on June 5th and 6th. Trialsmasters for the event were Sipapu's own Bruce Bolander, Sipapu's newest resident Brian Behling, John Browns Sr. & Jr, and "Wild" Willie Brown.

Bruce and Brian (the "Killer B's") set a fantastic trial for Saturday. Brian's lowers were set pretty close to the mountain base, right off the road for the most part. The creek was not set at all this year due to the fast moving water from the heavy snow runoff still occurring in early June. No water sections meant off-camber hillside and log fun! Bruce's upper sections ran maybe 1/3rd of the way up, but the killer single-track section trail more than made up for the lack of altitude. Winding through the woods and popping out right next to sections, Bruce must have put as much if not more effort into the upper section trail than the sections themselves. Crazy fun.

Once again the energy, so to speak, was turned up on Sunday. While the sections were set pretty close to the Saturday sections, the difficulty level seemed to have been turned up a notch or three. They were fun, but very challenging. The Brown boys certainly have the "eye" for sections that push the envelope of each class. Good job, fellas. I vote that you guys set on a Saturday next year so that my creaky old trials bones get a break on Sunday for the long drive home.

Thanks again Bruce, Brian, and Browns (this "Killer B" club is getting pretty big!)! All of you did a lot of hard work to make yet another super Sipapu event.
